Living the Truth, our Advent Goal

The First Reading speaks of the extravagant preparations God makes for the restoration of His people. (Israel having been clothed in mourning will now be

clothed in splendor, with the cloak of justice and a mitre on her head making Jerusalem a holy, priestly city. The children of Israel will return to her from all the farthest corners of the earth.) Even now He makes those same preparations so that we can turn our hearts to Him. During this Advent season, we are called to return to God from the exile we have created for ourselves through lives of selfishness and sin. • The Responsorial continues this theme of restoration, speaking of the joy of returning from exile to a land of fertility. Leaving that self-created exile of selfishness and sin gives us the joy of embracing God, and responding to Him, our deepest need. Surrendering to His love will transform the desert of our hearts and give us the power of selfdiscipline, making our hearts a land overflowing with fertility. • The Second Reading, St. Paul wrote shortly after facing death. Now he knows what is truly important and he prays that we may discern aright, growing in love while seeking and finding the truth. St. Paul prays that we do so while there is still time and discover what is pure and blameless. This is a goal of the Advent season: to seek the truth with all our strength, to purify our hearts so that we can live the truth and be found blameless at the coming of the Lord (on Christmas day and at the end of time). • The Gospel calls us to prepare the way for the Lord: to turn away from sin so that we can embrace the salvation God offers. We cannot hope to embrace the Babe of Bethlehem if we do not turn away from sin.

Faith First

Sacrament of Reconciliation

Two powerful effects of baptism are forgiveness of sin and the adoption of the baptized into God's family. Further, the Holy Spirit given in the sacraments of

baptism and confirmation and the reception of the Lord in the Eucharist make us holy. However, the new life we receive through the sacraments of initiation does not take away our weakened human nature. Our inclination to sin (traditionally termed concupiscence) remains, requiring a lifelong struggle to conversion. • A major help in this struggle to heed Jesus' command to repent and to believe in the gospel is the sacrament of conversion, also termed penance, confession, forgiveness, and reconciliation. • We call it the sacrament of conversion because it makes sacramentally present Jesus' call to repent. This, in fact, is the first step for sinners to take in returning to the loving Father who awaits with open arms. This sacrament calls Catholics as individuals and as a community to turn to God's infinite mercy and walk the path of renewal. • We call it the sacrament of penance to emphasize that a life of conversion involves doing penance and making satisfaction for sins we have committed. • We call it the sacrament of confession because an essential element of the sacrament is to tell our sins to the priest. Through this sacrament we also "confess," that is, acknowledge and praise God for the bounteous mercy God extends to us. • We call it the sacrament of forgiveness to underscore that through the priest's absolution God imparts pardon and peace. • Finally, we call it the sacrament of reconciliation because God's love empowers us to become reconciled, to become one again, with those we have harmed through our sins.
